PRESENT-THE HONBLE. MR. JUSTICE MONK.

The facts of this most important case appear from the remarks of the Court (Mr. Justice Monk) in giving judgment for Plaintiff, at Montreal, the 9th July, 1867, as follows:—

This is an action instituted the 13th of May, 1864, for the recovery by the Plaintiff of the sixth portion of one half of the estate in Defendant's possession, and claimed by Plaintiff as his share in a community of property alleged by him to have existed between his father, the late William Connolly, and Susanne, Connolly's wife, mother of the Plaintiff. The case is one of importance, and involves a great number and variety of questions, both of law and fact.
