PLUMBERS AND BOSSES **BREAK OFF NEGOTIATIONS** Men Unable to Concede Principle of Open Shop and Strike

Again there is a deadlock in the mbers' situation.

The Employers' Association have decided that the "open shop" shall be maintained at all costs, consequently the negotiations that have been going on for the past few days have been broken off.

The employers' decision was made known to the men at a mass meeting of the local union at the Labor Temple when it was unanimously resolved to withdraw the modified terms submit-ted to the bosses and continue the

"In the meantime, we revert to our original propositions. Your statement that it is not a matter of wages at all, is quite ingenuous.
