TO CHANGE COMPANIES ACT

Hon. Mr. Scott Introduces a Bill into the Senate With This End in View.

ENGLISH LAW HAS BEEN FOLLOWED

What Now Takes Weeks Will Be Accomplished in a Few Days.

Ottawa, Ont., April 8.—In the Senate to-day Hon. Mr. Scott introduced a bill respecting the issuing of charters to joint stock companies by letters patent. The bill is intended to facilitate the issuing of charters and to make the Canadian law the same as the English law in this respect.

There are seven persons, on signing articles of agreement specifying the amount of stock which each subscribed and lodging the agreement with the registrar, may receive a certificate of incorporation. A royal commission appointed to enquire into these matters in England had, Mr. Scott said, reported most favorably on extending facilities for incorporation.

In Canada it now took 8 to 10 weeks to obtain a charter. Under the new act it would take only a few days, and would require no deposit of money as at present. Of course this only ap-

plies to the case of companies in which the share capital is not to be paid up.
