Robinson, ploneer baseball man, owner of the old Cleveland American Associa-tion and later of the St. Louis Cardinals, died suddenly of apoplexy late yesterday afternoon at his home. The exciting ninth inning of the Cleve-land-Washington game this afternoon killed him, says his friends. Slightly in-disposed, he had the returns telephoned to his room from a down town hotel, play by play. The cleveland pitcher, had been holding his own against Witherup, the Washington pitcher, until the ninth in-ning, when the Capital City team by heavy batting broke the 1 to 1 the by scoring five runs in rapid succession. As the telephone operator gave him play for play, Robinson's excitement grew. When the inning was ended the telephone receiver fell from his hand and he sank back in his chair in a stupor. He died in an hour. Mr. Robinson was 56 years old. He and M. Stanley Robinson bought the St. Louis Nationals in 1898. Two years ago he resigned the presidency of the club and sold his holdings. Since then he has also a raliway magnate.
