Collections, However, Rather Slow, Says Report of Canadian Credit Men.

Winnipeg, April '23 .- (By Canadian Press.)-Trade reports received this week from all the chief centres of Canada indicate a continuance of business activity, says the weekly state ment of the Canadian Credit Men's Trust Association. Collections are, however, slow, and on the average about five per cent. below those of the corresponding period of 1919.

Grocery houses, boots, shoes, goods and hardware in Winnipeg all report a continual flow of orders with prices firm. Hardware and metal trades find difficulty in obtaining goods and this will have a tendency to slack up trade and work along this line. Retailers are, as a whole, fairly busy, with the clothing trades a little perturbed by a campaign of cutting


