



JOURNAL OF SYNOD.

THURSDAY, 6th July, A. D. 1871.

The Bishop, Clergy, and Representatives of the laity of the Diocese of Fredericton, in the Province of New Brunswick, having on this day at two o'clock P. M. met at the Madras school house in the City of Fredericton, pursuant to a notice given by the Bishop of the Diocese, and according to the provisions of an Act of Assembly passed at the last session of the Provincial Legislature (34 Victoria, cap. 8 *) intituled "An Act relating to the Synod of the Church of England in the Diocese of Fredericton and Province of New Brunswick," and the said Act having been produced, the Bishop read the notice given by him, calling, at this time and place, the first meeting to be held as therein provided, as published in the *Royal Gazette* for four successive weeks, namely, on the 7th, 14th, 21st, and 28th days of June last.

On motion, the meeting adjourned to the Supreme Court Room in the Province Buildings.
