

coming under provincial controul and management (in accordance with the post office act of the last session of Parliament), which will doubtless involve many new arrangements and changes; not the least beneficial of which will be the reduction of postage on single letters, any distance within the Province, or Provinces of British North America, to a uniform rate of three-pence currency each, and in the same proportion for those of greater weight, according to the following scale, viz.:

Not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. in weight	- - -	One rate of postage.
Exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. and not exceeding 1 oz.	- -	Two rates "
" 1 oz. " 2 oz.	- -	Four rates "

and so on; every additional ounce to be charged two additional rates, and every fraction of an ounce as an additional ounce.

According to existing arrangements—

The Eastern, Western, and Southern and U. S. mails, are closed daily at 5 P. M.

The Northern mail and mail by Streetsville stage daily (Sundays excepted) at 2 P. M.

The Albion route, on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, at $1\frac{1}{2}$ P. M.

Letters for England despatched (daily, and should not be later than Friday via Montreal; can be sent subsequently via U. S. on payment of $2\frac{1}{2}$ d. each single letter.

During steamboat navigation, the principal, or as they are called, Grand Eastern and Western mails and Southern mail, go by water; the Eastern mail by steamer, closing at 11 A. M., and the Western mail by do. at 1 P. M.—for Niagara Frontier and United States at 5 P. M.

We are not in receipt of the necessary information to enable us, as we intended, to give an alphabetical list of the post-offices in Canada, with the name and designation of the city, town, village or township and county wherein situated, as well as the name of the postmaster and the distances in miles from Toronto.

The Post-office Surveyor's office is two or three doors west of the Post-office.
