RELIEF FUND FOR THE BRITISH SAILORS

Montreal, June 8, 1917.
To the Editor of The Times:—

Sir:—I am directed to inform you that at a meeting of the executive held on May 21, it was decided to send to the British admiralty a further \$200,000 for distribution among institutions caring for navy men and their dependents, and also \$200,000 to Sir George Perley, for the sailors of the mercantile marine and their dependents, which will make, in all, the sum of \$1,400,000 forwarded to the Mother Country, as a result of the campaign conducted throughout Canada for this fund.

I am further directed to say that it was also resolved to close the British Sailors' Relief Fund, and to form a Canadian Navy League, branch of the Navy League, London.

The league will carry on all further sailors' relief work, and monies in hand or that will be received, will be turned over to the new organization, and this

and all money raised in the future, will be transmitted to the Navy League, London, and distributed by them to the various naval institutions and hospitals requiring assistance.
The Navy League is a patriotic and non-party organization, composed of voluntary members, with a small annual fee, whose principal aim is to bring home to the people of the British Empire the vital importance of retaining, at whatever sacrifice, the supreme command of the sea. It is most essential that the entire population of this great empire—men and women, and in whatever class of life—should have opportunities of studying at first hand, the problems of national defence and of knowing something about the navy which is, and must always be, the mainstay of the Empire. We have an Empire of 13,000,000 square miles to protect, the entire foundations of which are laid on sea power.

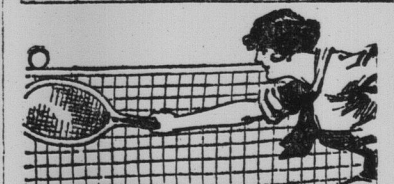
LIBERALS WIN IN ALBERTA

Sifton Government Sustained With Majority as Great as Before

Edmonton, June 7.—Results to 8 o'clock indicate the return of the Sifton government by a majority fully as large as that in the last legislature, where it was 38 to 18. In Edmonton three seats have gone Conservative.

All cabinet ministers are elected, although Cross is running close in Edson, and there are two polls to come from Beaver River, where Gariepy is leading by a narrow margin.

Later, the election of both ministers was conceded. The result of today's election is an overwhelming victory for the Liberals, who now completely dominate the west.

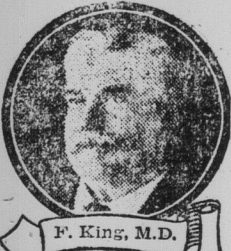

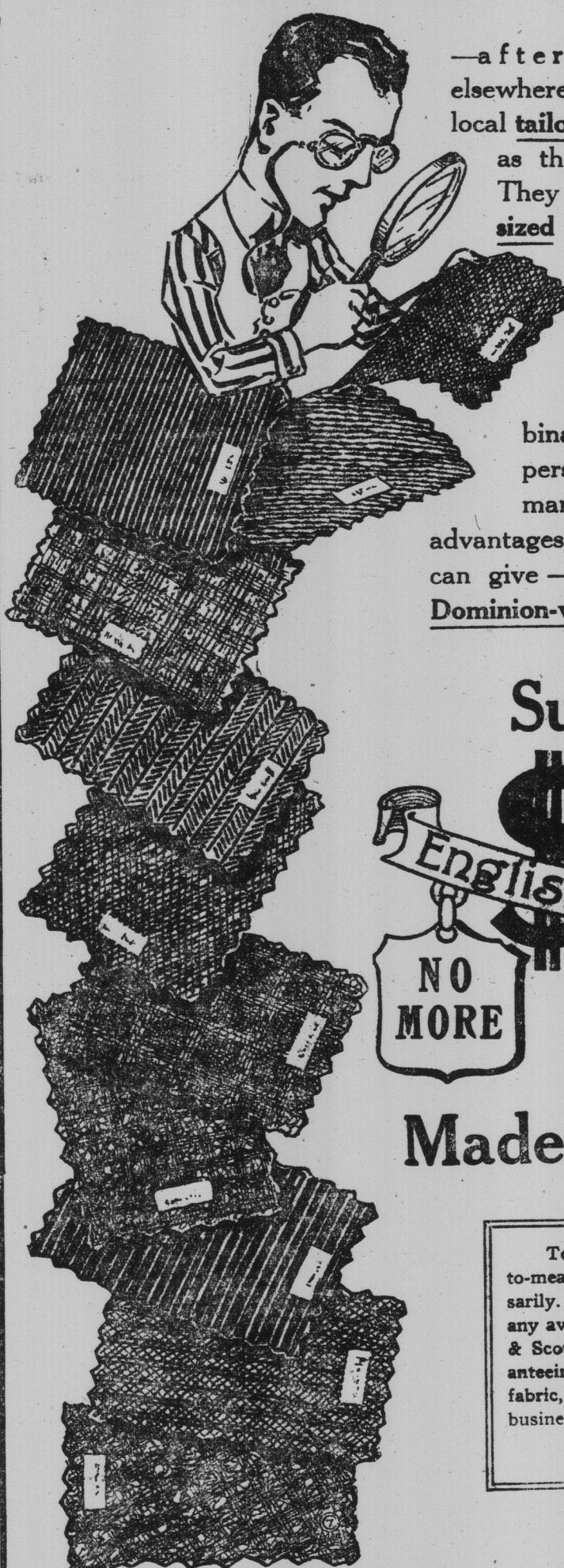

Moncton, June 7.—Under the I. C.
