



"intreal, Feb. 6.—A deputation representing the Anti-Liquor League of the Province of Quebec waited upon Premier Taschereau on Saturday and asked for the abolition of all taverns as well as of permits to sell alcoholic beverages in clubs, dance halls, cabarets and gardens. The only concession suggested by the league was the sale of beer by the bottle and that only through a salaried employe who would have no financial interest in the transaction.

The premier raised the question of advisability of providing for the taking of a plebiscite or local option vote in localities where permits might be asked for, and the delegation expressed themselves as favoring such a course.
