The task of Canada must be the task of promoting the thing for which the boys who died gave their lives: the promotion of international justice, goodwill and peace. Canada is the connecting link between the new world and the old, and we must have a living memory in the minds and hearts of our people of peace and progress and goodwill to sustain the ideals that the boys of Canada fought and suffered and died to bring about." 
