MOUNT ALLISON REGENTS MEET

Add \$100,000 to Endowment Fund—Decide to Erect New Gymnasium—Outlook Promising.

Sackville, May 18.—The regents of Mount Allison have been in session all day and did not adjourn until a late hour tonight. Rev. Dr. Steel, of St. John, was in the chair and other members of the board present included: Rev. Dr. Hertz, E. E. Hewson, Rev. A. S. Rogers, N. T. Avar, Amherst; R. C. Tait, Shediac; Rev. George A. Ross, Bathurst; Rev. H. E. Thomas, Devon; Dr. Allison, S. M. Brookfield, Rev. H. G. Fulton, Halifax; H. A. Powell, Rev. G. M. Young, E. R. Machum, St. John; James E. Burchell, H. F. S. Poirer, Sydney; Dr. Borden, Dr. W. G. Col. F. B. Black, C. W. Fawcett, C. C. Avar, Mrs. H. M. Wood, Mrs. Howard Sprague, Hon. J. Wood and Dr. Palmer, Sackville, and Varley B. Fullerton, Parrashoro. Reports relative to the Mount Allison campaign for funds were submitted. It was decided to add \$100,000 to the amount subscribed to the endowment fund and to proceed immediately with the erection of a gymnasium building to replace Lingley hall, which was destroyed by fire in January last. The last year at Mount Allison has been eminently satisfactory from every standpoint and the future is looked forward to with pleasure and assurance. Hon. Josiah Wood tendered his resignation as treasurer of the board to take effect next fall.

SARDINE BOATS TO PAY PILOTAGE

It was announced at the customs house yesterday that a pilotage collection would be levied on all sardine boats coming to the port of St. John. All boats under thirty tons will be charged \$8 and all over thirty tons will be charged \$7.50. It is expected that this announcement will not be learned with much favor by the local weir owners, as it may have the effect of keeping sardine vessels from this port.
