REV. MR. LANG ACCEPTS

Will go to Toronto Church-Church Discusses Union, Communion Cups and Choir Gowns

At a large and representative meeting of the congregation of St. Andrew's Presbyterian church, last evening, the resignation of Rev. David Lang, M.A., B.D., pastor for the last seven and one-half years, was accepted, the members deciding to place no obstacle in the way of the Presbytery accepting the call to Mr. Lang. The Presbytery will meet on Tuesday next, and Mr. Lang will leave for To ronto to become assistant to Rev. Di Wallace in the Bloor street Presbyteria wallace in the Bloor street Presbyterian church early in December. At the same meeting the congregation decided to accede to the request of the choir to provide gowns for all members, and also voted to refer the question of individual communion cups to ballot by the congregation.

Church union was discussed, but the ballot will not be taken until the congregation has fully digested the basis of union as prepared by the general committee of the Presbyterian, Methodist and Congregational churches in Canada. Judge Forbes, a member of the committee, gave a brief and very interesting summary of the work accomplished by the committee and the arguments in favor of union.

Rev. Mr. Lang, as moderator, presided and Mr. Magee was secretary. Rev. Mr. Lang presented his resignation in the form of a letter, in which he dwelt on the importance of the work in Bloor street church, and his reasons for feeling that he was called to undertake it.

Hon. J. G. Forbes moved that no obstacles be placed in the way of his acceptance and after the expression of regret at their loss by several of the congregation, the motion carried. Dr. P. R. Inches, E. R. Reid, D. R. Jack and George Robertson were appointed to wait on the presbytery.

The advantages of individual communion cups were presented by B. R. Macaulay, who moved that they be adopted by the church. The amendment of Robert Magee that the matter be deferred until the next annual meeting was carried.

Mr. Lang introduced the subject of church union and asked that a vote be taken at an early date, so that the matter might be settled before the arrival of their new pastor. Judge Forbes spoke at length on the subject, outlining the plans for the union of the denominations and advocating its approval by St. Andzew's church. No action was taken.

Rev. Mr. Goodson, who has been conducting evangelistic services in Norten, was suggested as temporary supply for the pulpit and the matter was left to a committee of the session and trustees.


