BOSTON, Jan. 18—Two steamers and a three-masted schooner were damaged by a collision between the steamers in the harbor opposite Castle Island just after dark tonight, the steamers finally landing on the flats beside the channel.

The two steamers were the Melrose, inward bound from Newport News, laden with coal, and the Vera of Christiania, Norway, outward bound for Norfolk. The two collided, the Vera driving a deep dent into a plate under the port quarter of the Melrose and driving her on the East Boston flats.
