CLOSING COTTON LETTER.

New York, Nov. 7.—First prices this
morning made a poor response to
Liverpool and right after the call the
leading options sold off to a net loss
of 7 or 8 points under a considerable
volume of scattering liquidation and
short selling. On this decline, how-
ever, offerings were absorbed from
strong sources and when reports
reached the floor of rains in the cen-
tral and eastern belt prices ad-
vanced sharply and hereafter with unim-
portant intervals the trend was up-
ward. The rise was helped by re-
ports of forthcoming bullish crop es-
timates and the favorable tenor of
spot advices from the south. Around
1 o'clock the May option followed
early across the 12 cent line predicted
early in the day, but the expected
heavy realising at this point failed
to make its appearance, instead prices
drove up all along the line and
the final level ranged from 12 to 14
cents. The favorable
penny in contrast
