Mascots are as popular in Cuba as anywhere else. In fact, there is one in the "Magoon Fire House," or Centro de Perro, in Havana, which is so intelligent that the firemen would trade him for all the mascots in the world. Othello, as he is called, is a dog which came from somewhere some time ago; no one knows just where or when.

As a steward Othello has won special distinction. In the fire house are other mascots, many of them, over which Othello seems to be the acknowledged leader.

At ten minutes to five o'clock every afternoon Othello can be seen going from the fire house to the Cosmopolita Restaurant, where he will lie down in the middle of the sidewalk and wait until five minutes after five. At that time one of the waiters comes quietly and places a tray of meat scraps against one of the pillars and presently Othello rises leisurely, picks it up and carries it back to the fire house and distributes the morsels to the other dogs.

During the coming year the firemen believe that Othello will be pointed out to the tourists as one of the city's chief attractions.

## LARCHMONT WANTS THE YACHT CUP

New York, May 16.—Still another club has sent a challenge for the Manhattan Yacht Cup, now held by the Chicago Yacht Club. The announcement comes from the Larchmont Yacht Club, which states that it will be represented in the races on Lake Michigan.

It was won last year by the Chicago Yacht Club in an interesting series on Long Island Sound. The trophy will be defended by a new yacht now nearing completion at City Island.

## TENNIS TEAM CHOSEN FOR THE STATES

New York, May 16.—Maurice E. McLoughlin, of California; R. Norris Williams, of Pennsylvania; and Harold H. Hackett and Raymond D. Little, both of this city, were officially nominated yesterday as the American lawn tennis team for the Davis International Cup matches against the Australians. The selections were announced after a meeting of the American committee, which included R. D. Wrenn, chairman, H. W. Slocum and G. T. Ades. The nominations will stand for the matches which will be played on the turf courts of the West Side Tennis Club, in this city, on June 6, 7 and 8.

Mr. McLoughlin stands as No. 1 on the ranking list and holds the national championship in both singles and doubles, as well as other important titles. Mr. Williams is now at Harvard. He was the sensation of the last season, ranking No. 2 to Mr. McLoughlin. His chief victory was the winning of the national clay court championship at the Pittsburg Athletic Association.

Mr. Hackett's record as a doubles player has never been duplicated on the American courts. He was rated three times with different partners last season. He has held the national title and at times all of the other important ones. Mr. Little was rated No. 8 in singles last season. He has figured in other international cup matches and was also rated in the doubles with Hackett, with whom he has been playing steadily this season.
