NATIONALISTS BACK UP DEMAND OF REDMOND

Want Home Rule Bill Brought Down at Once and Measure Within Terms of Settlement Agreed Upon.

London, July 22 (2.30 p. m.)—A meeting of the Nationalist members of the House of Commons in London today approved the demand of John Redmond that the Irish Home Rule Bill be introduced without delay, and that it shall not go in any respect beyond the terms of the settlement agreed upon. The meeting adjourned until Monday, by which time it is expected Mr. Redmond will have been advised of the course adopted by the cabinet at its session today.

NEWS A UNITED STATES STEEL LEADER ON SATURDAY

Represented About 20 Per Cent. of the Total Turn-over for Session.

UNUSUAL ACTIVITY FOR A WEEK-END

Motor Issues Especially Prominent With Gain of 2 to 3 Points in Willys-Overland and Maxwell.

New York, July 22.—For a mid-summer week-end session, today's market was unusually active, broad and strong. Special stocks again afforded the basis of a large proportion of the total turnover, being in further demand by the bears on short interest, that factor suffering additional impairment of "paper profit."

Motor issues were particularly prominent, with gains of two to three points in Willys-Overland and Maxwell, and 10 for General Motors. Subsidies and Allied shares were substantially better, together with Tobaccos, American Beet Sugar and preferred, American Beet Sugar and the zinc issue.

United States Steel was the real leader, trading in that stock representing about 20 per cent. of the whole, at an extreme advance of 1 1/8, most of which was retained. There was a better tone to shares of the independent steel companies, notably Lackawanna and Republic, together with Colorado Fuel and American Car. Rails were again relegated to a place of minor importance, even the investment issues moving sluggishly. Reading closed with a fractional gain, but Wisconsin Central forfeited four points of its recent advance. Shipping shares also were backward, with no material price changes. Total sales of stocks amount to 173,000,000 shares.

The bank statement reflected a substantial cash gain, the actual increase of about \$13,500,000 being in excess of all estimates, while loans showed further contraction, with an increase of almost \$13,000,000 in reserves, bringing the total excess up to \$108,000,000, against \$33,546,000 two weeks ago.

Weekly reports of the mercantile agencies were of a confident tenor, the only discouraging note coming from that portion of the south which recently experienced severe storms. Dry goods lines the volume of distribution shows an increase. Bonds were steady today on nominal trading. International issues were firmer.

Total sales, par value, aggregated \$1,055,000.
United States bonds were unchanged on call during the week.
