New York, July 22.—For a mid-summer week-end session, today's market was unusually active, broad and strong. Speciel stocks again afforded the basis of a large proportion of the total overturn, being in further domand by the bears on short interest, that faction suffering additional impairment of "paper profit."

Rails were again relegated to a place of minor importance, even the investment issues moving sluggishly. Reading closed with a fractional gain, but Wisconsin Central forfeited four points of its recent advance. Shipping shares also were backward, with no material price changes. Total sales of stocks amount to 173,000 shores.

The bank statement reflected a substantial cash gain, the actual increase of about \$13,500,000 being in excess of all estimates, while loans showed further contraction, with an increase of almost \$13,000,000 in reserves, bringing the total excess up to \$108,000,000, against \$53,546,000 two weeks ago.
