The early withdrawal of the American troops at Viadivostok was referred to by Secretary Baker in a conference with newspaper men a few days ago, and at that time the Secretary was emphatic in his statement that no such plans were under consideration. The American troops, Mr. Baker said, were sent to Siberia to assist the Czecho-Slovak ferces, and to protect the military stores at Viadivostok from the Bolsevik armies.
