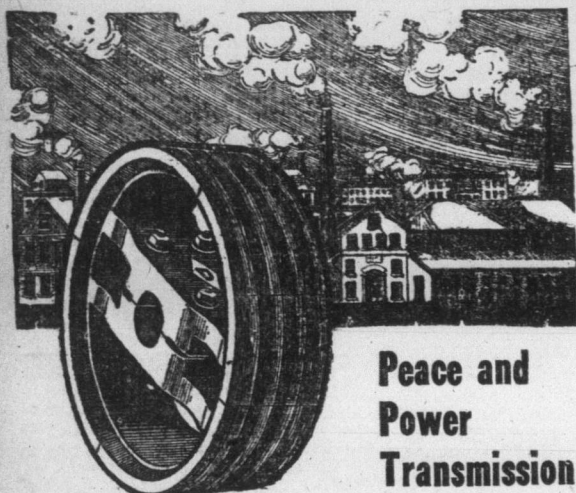

A London report says:—"It amused Manager Keenan of the London M.C. League Club yesterday when he read that President McCaffrey of the Toronto Internationals, had signed up Catcher Russell Gee, of the Toronto Park Nine Club who had signed weeks ago, and only arranged with Manager Gibson on Monday night to give Gee a workout at the Island with the Leafs as Mooney needed several backstops for the spring training of his pitchers.

Catcher Summers of the Brantford semi-pros also accepted Keenan's terms weeks ago, despite the fact that Kitchener is expecting him to turn out with Beauty's men at the end of the month. Summers will visit Keenan on Saturday and may also join the training at the Toronto Island this week.

The Snyder whom Manager Gibson is expecting to get from Brooklyn is none other than Jack Snyder who did backstop duty with the London Canadian League Club in 1914 when Doc Reisinger was manager here.

Keenan is well supplied with catchers as he has Tree and Kelly in addition to Gee and Summers and has still another good one yet to close with.

### Will Be Much M. O. Travelling

League will Ask for Reduction in Railway Fares  
Secretary-Treasurer Wilson of the Michigan-Ontario Baseball League has called the attention of the Eastern Canadian Passengers' Association to the fact that travel of the eight clubs in

the league will be so extensive during the coming season that a departure from the high railway rates now prevailing is in order.

The association is holding its monthly meeting in Toronto on Tuesday April 15 and this matter will come up for discussion.

There are numerous occasions during the season when a jump from Canadian cities of the eight clubs will mean an extensive movement of as many as 125 passengers for points in Michigan. This will require special accommodation the railways requiring to send extra cars and Pullmans. The same condition will prevail when the Canadian clubs jump back to their Ontario homes for games with the Michigan clubs and any reduction in the fares that the association may see fit to make is well merited and will mean a great help towards the financial success of the organization.

It is safe to say that few minor leagues in existence are so situated with abundance of holiday dates in addition to Sunday baseball in Michigan and in order to carry out the schedule the question of transportation is one of the big features which must be considered.

The total mileage of the eightclubs is about 28,000 miles and when this is multiplied by 15 as each club will carry that number of men an aggregate of 420,000 miles of travel are involved. If this proposition is not worthy of consideration of the passenger association the league officials would like to hear from transportation officials.

There are many fight experts who are confident Dempsey will be the victor over Willard when they meet. In an interview with Jimmy Britt, the former light-weight boxer, Britt handed out the following:

"Who would I pick as the winner in the Willard-Dempsey match? Why Dempsey, to be sure." Britt has seen both men in action, and he is firmly convinced of Dempsey's superiority. There will be 25 rounds of boxing in addition to the Dempsey end of the programme, and the bouts will measure up to the S.P.A. standard.

ESTELLE IS SIGNED BY LEE FOR THE BRANTFORD TEAM.

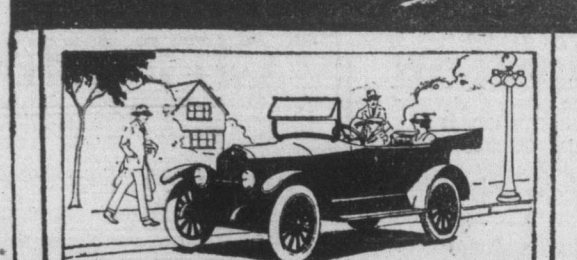
