An Act respecting the inspection of Steamboats, and the examination and licensing of Engineers employed on them.

IER Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows :---

## SHORT TITLE.

1. This Act may be cited as The Steamboat Inspection Act, Short title. 5 1898.

## INTERPRETATION.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a.) The expression "steamboat" includes any vessel used boat."

Interpretation "Steamboat" in navigation or afloat on navigable water, and propelled wholly or in part by steam; or by any machinery or power 10 other than sails or oars; [and includes steam dredges and floating elevators];

(b.) The expression "owner" means the registered owner "Owner." only;

(c.) [For the purpose of collecting the yearly rate or duty "Year." 15 hereinafter imposed, the expression "year" means the calendar year, commencing on the first day of January and ending, on the thirty-first day of December, and for the purpose of the inspection hereinafter rendered imperative the expression. "year" means twelve calendar months from the date of the

20 certificate of inspection;

(d.) The expression "boilers and machinery" includes the "Boilers and machinery." steam engine or engines, and every part thereof or thing connected therewith, employed in propelling the steamboat, and any donkey or pony engine used on board, and the boiler 25 or boilers for supplying steam thereto, and the furnaces, chimneys, flues, safety and blow-off valves, gauges, braces, stays, pipes, steam pumps, and all other apparatus and things attached to or connected therewith or used with reference to any such engine or under the care of the engineer;

(e.) The expression "hull and equipment" includes the "Hull and hull and every part thereof, masts, sails and rigging when equipment."
