C A P. XXXVIII.

An Act for regulating the Exportation of Corn and other Articles to Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, the Bay of Chaleur, and the Coast of Labrador.

[15th April 1813.]

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for regulating the 31 G.3. c.32 Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn exported; the Exportation of Corn and other Articles is allowed to Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, the Bay of Chaleur, and the Coast of Labrador, from certain Ports in certain Quantities as described in the Table marked C. in the faid A&, at the Time when the general Exportation of Corn and other Articles is prohibited by the said Act: And whereas it is now judged that such Supply of Corn and other Articles might be more conveniently provided, if instead of the certain Ports and certain Quantities specified in the said Table, the Exportation thereof was allowed from fuch Ports and in fuch Quantities from each Port as shall from Time to Time be directed by the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council appointed for the Consideration of all Matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the same, That, from and after the Com 200 passing of this Act, the whole Quantity of Corn and other Articles allowed other Articles by the said Act according to the said Table marked C. to be exported to in Table C.
