Some lean R and R from Parker, Rumours

Graham Parker and the Rumours. Howlin' Wind. Ver-tigo. 6360-129.

This album is rock and roll at its uncluttered best.

White Honey, Soul Shoes, Back to Schooldays and Lady Doctor have a raw, loose feeling about them, with fine playing by the Rumours and perfect "black-leader" singing by Parker.

You've Got to Be Kidding is a gem and shows the heavy influence of Bob Dylan.

Parker has been getting some rave reviews in the United States. I hope he comes to Canada to do some concerts so we can get a better idea of his music.

Entries sought for annual juried art show

The Mississauga Library System's second annual juried art show starts Jan. 31 and runs through to Feb. 24 at Central library.

Brochures giving details of the show are on their way to local artists, or may be picked up at any library in the system.

A. Peter Harris, director and curator of Rodman Hall, St. Catharines, will judge the work. Prizes will be art books.

The library show is open and not limited to residents of Mississauga. Work must be original. Each artist may enter two pictures. Three-dimensional work is not eligible. Pictures should not exceed four feet by four feet and must be framed or otherwise prepared for exhibition.

Entries will be accepted at Central during library hours Saturday, Jan. 29, and Sunday, Jan. 30.

Harris will make his selection Monday, Jan. 31, and meet the entrants to discuss his choices at 7 p.m. on Monday.

Last year's exhibition attracted more than 120 entries, and 30 were selected for hanging.

Harris is an artist in his own right, with pictures in public and private collections, including the Bronfman Collection at Montreal Museum of Fine Art, Sir George Williams University, the Robert McLaughlin Gallery in Oshawa, the Canada Council Art Bank and the Ontario Institute of Special Education in Toronto.

Rodman Hall recently acquired National Exhibition Centre Status, which means it is equipped to handle precious works of art, and has special humidity and light controls without which art work could be damaged.

Questions about the juried art show can be answered by library artist Ona Alisauskas at 279-7002.

Port Credit library is the venue for an exhibition of prints from Mississauga Library System's own permanent collection.

About 30 prints will be on display in the Texaco Room from Monday, Jan. 17 to Feb. 5.

Among them is The Yes or No Twig by Toller Cranston, who has been described as "a part-time skater, full-time artist."

Cranston is a world-class figure skater, who has also developed a reputation with his detailed drawings and designs.

Andy Donato, cartoonist with the Toronto Sun, is represented by a serigraph. Polychromie T is the title of a print by Alfred Pellon, one of Canada's most famous artists, who has been named a Companion of the Order of Canada for his work. A film about him is available from Central.

Jack Hamilton Bush will have a print on display. He is one of Canada's best-known artists on the international scene, with work exhibited in the Edinburgh Festival, Paris and Rome.

Edward Bartram's Island Forms is an abstraction of sky, cloud and land, with shoreline and reflection. Bartram has worked in the Canada Council Art Bank, as well as in university and private collections across the country.

Claude Tousignant's Tryptique I is a serigraph of three geometric forms in red, blue and yellow. Tousignant has worked in the National Gallery,

and Art Gallery of Ontario, among others, and several in art galleries in the U.S.

Philonene is the title of a serigraph by Jacques Hurtubise, who has worked in the National Gallery and Art Gallery of Ontario, and in various well-known collections in Canada and the U.S.

Mississauga Library System has an exciting collection of books about prints and printmaking. Getting Started in Prints and Patterns by Stanley Rice includes simple printing methods, basic shapes and sketches, pictures of tools and how to use them.

Simple Printmaking by Cyril Kent and Mary Cooper is a pocketbook, and similar in content.

From here on, books become more technical.

The Complete New Techniques in Printmaking by John Ross and Clare Romano provides information on the collagraph, dimensional print, dry lithography, photographic prints, how to make them, care for them, collect them and sell them.

The Art of Printmaking by Erich Rhein is a comprehensive guide to graphic techniques, for those with some technical knowledge, and the same applies to Printmaking: Methods Old and New by Gabor Peterdi.

Recent developments in printmaking and the revival of print-selling make About Prints by S. W. Hayer of special interest. It is long on

detail, short (for an art book) on illustration.

Anthony Gross, avant-garde artist, painter and etcher is the author of Etching and Engraving, a textbook on techniques, which even tells how to make corrections.

Diagrams and photographs are a feature of The Technique of Etching and Engraving by John Brunson. It deals not only with tools and equipment, but with studio or workshop layout.

The introduction of the roller to the paint industry almost revolutionized housepainting. And there's something in it for the artist, too, says F. H. Stomham in Painting and Printmaking with Rollers.

From the viewpoint of our south declarer, the deal diagrammed here might be classified, paradoxically, as a "tragedy." He bid and made a vulnerable grand slam! Yet, when the scores were posted, he had received the worst score on the deal. The hand came up in a seven-trick duplicate game, and the deal was played seven times.

West's queen of clubs opening was won by south's king. When south next laid down the trump ace, he received the discouraging news that west had started with the five outstanding trumps. Nevertheless, south did not quit.

He cashed the ace of clubs, after which he played his ace, king and queen of hearts, discarding two diamonds from dummy. Then came a diamond to the board's ace. This was followed by the king and queen of diamonds, south discarding his two and eight of hearts. Thus far, declarer had taken the first nine tricks.

Dummy's high jack of diamonds was now led — and south ruffed it with his queen of trumps. West, who had nothing left but trumps, was compelled to undertrump with the six. A trump was then led and dummy's nine successfully finessed. The board's king and jack of trumps took the last two tricks and south chalked up 2,210 points (trick

score of 210; 500 for the vulnerable game, and 1,500 for the grand slam).

Each of the six times that this deal was replayed, the various north-south pairs all arrived at a grand slam contract — in notrump! As is evident, all of them made 13 tricks no matter how they played it. Each of them scored 2,220 points (trick score of 220; 500 for the game, and 1,500 for the grand slam).

Thus, of the seven results, our declarer's score of 2,210 was the lowest. In retrospect, whether he fulfilled his contracting or had gone down, he would have secured the same "bottom on the board." On some days, it just doesn't pay to get up.

Both sides vulnerable. North deals.
