OFFICE OF THE CANADIAN IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT1-3, REGENT STREET, LONDON.

Under Order-in-Council P.C. of 10th February, 1922,  
it is directed that "all the official activities of the various  
agencies of the Canadian Government in the United Kingdom should  
be placed under the supervision of the High Commissioner".

The present organization is administered by the Supt.  
of Immigration, who is directly responsible to the Minister in  
charge of Immigration and Colonization at Ottawa, and is distinct  
from the High Commissioner. The matters now handled arise under  
the following heads:

Deportation from Canada of undesirables.  
Repatriation - Ex Canadian Service cases.  
Overseas Settlement - Ex Imperial Service cases.  
Assisted Emigration - Individuals or Groups.  
Publicity - Newspapers and Pamphlets.  
Lectures and Lantern Slide Exhibition.  
Show Work - Exhibitions.  
Foreign Correspondence cases.  
Woman's Section.
