Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 18th ultime, relative to the proposed purchase of a threshing cutfit for the Indians of Cote's Band; and in reply I may say with regard to the matter of payment in connection with which you have remarked that you consider that the sum of \$272.00 should not be deducted from the \$2720.00 realized from the cale of land belonging to the band, that Section No 70 of the Indian Act provides that a percentage shall be taken from all money realized on cales of Indian lands and timber and placed to the redit of Management Pund. You will therefore see that in making this deduction the Department is acting in accordance with custom and in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

With reference to the balance of \$1184.50 thus left available, I beg to say that an Order-in-Council has been passed authorizing the expenditure of the same, in accordance with the desire of the band, towards the purchase of a steam threshing outfit.

You may buy the outfit in question from Mr J.T. 1011, of Yorkton, but the cost of the same, over and above \$1154.00 must be borne by the Indians themselves from one other source, and the indian you should explain this fact thoroughly to Mr Hall before making the purchase.
