Ottawa, Sept. 2, 1913.

Sir,

I beg to refer to your letter dated Feb. 5, 1910, enclosing a resolution from the Indian Council as follows:

Movember 4th, 1910.

We the undersigned Chief and Council, of the Manitou Rapids Band, Reserve No. 11, at a Council held in the presence of the Indian Agent, agree to allowing "Messrs. Nelson and Cassaday, permission to extend the "Hyland Spur in the Manitou Rapids Reserve No. 11; 160 "yards west and 100 yards deep, which contains about "ja acres of land, on the understanding that Messrs." Nelson & Casseday pay us the sum of \$60.00, (Sixty "Dollars) in cash, for clearing the land, and employing "Indian labour as much as possible in loading cars, and "we to have the privilege of loading our own material "on this siding. This permission is given for two years "from date of this agreement.
