TAKING OF LOUISBURG, 1758.

TAKING OF QUEBEC.

BATTLE OF THE HEIGHTS OF ABRAHAM, 1759.

1. John Macdonell (Lochgarry)—Captain 78th Regiment (Fraser's Highlanders); afterwards Colonel 76th Regiment (Macdonald Highlanders); wounded at the taking of Quebec. (Had previously served in the Garde Ecossaise, Ogilvie's Corps, after Culloden. The attainder was levied in his favour.)
2. Charles Macdonell, son of Glengarry—Captain 78th Regiment (Fraser's Highlanders); wounded at the Battle of the Heights of Abraham; killed at the capture of St. John's, Newfoundland.
3. Ranald Macdonell, son of Keppoch—Lieutenant 78th Regiment (Fraser's Highlanders); wounded at the taking of Quebec.
4. William Macdonell -- Lieutenant 78th Regiment (Fraser's Highlanders).
5. John Macdonell (Leek)—Lieutenant 78th Regiment (Fraser's Highlanders); wounded at the taking of Louisburg; served through the Revolutionary War; died a Colonel in the service. (He had been on the staff of Prince Charles Stuart in 1745, and was twice wounded at Culloden.) *Father of Lt. Col. George Macdonnell*
6. Alexander Macdonell (son of Barrisdale)—Lieutenant 78th Regiment (Fraser's Highlanders); killed at the taking of Quebec.
