To eftablish this point clear beyond misapprehension, we may confider fin as a debt, Matt. vi. 12. in order to a discharge from which, proper payment must be made to the law, and fatisfaction given to the juffice of the Judge : Accordingly our furety has given himfelf a price. an infinitely precious price, a ranfoming price, to pay our, debt, Matt. xx. 28. 1 Pet. i. 18. 19 .-- We may alo fo confider lin as a real enmity against God, Rom. viii. 7: for which proper fatisfaction, must make reconciliation for us. Confequently our furety in the divine law, takes away this enmity by the reconciling facrifice of himfelf, Col. i. 20. 21. 2 Cor. v. 19. 21.-Sin may be further confidered as a crime, which makes us guilty before God our Judge, and for which, a full fatisfaction must be given to the law, in order to explate our guilt. That the Son of God might effectually accomplifh this; he as our furety, placed himfelf in our flead, took on him our fin, and by offering up himfelf a facrifice to divine juffice, has borne a fatisfactory and meritorious punifhment for our guilt, Gal. iii. 13. 1 Pet. ii. 24. Dan. ix. 24. Thus he has taken on him, and by his blood has removed our violations of the divine law, which is the foundation of God's displeasure.

What can be clearer from fcripture, than that our fins were the meritorious caufe of his fufferings? And if fo, then our guilt muft have been charged on him, and punifhed in him. For he has delivered us from the curfe of the law, how? by being made a curfe for us. Do not thefe words plainly imply a translation of punifhment? Not we, who were guilty, but he, who was innocent, fuffered the penalty, which the law denounced on us, in confequence of difobedience. The law denounceth, Curfed is every one, that continueth not in all things written in the book of thelaw to do them. To this curfe Chrift, as our fubfitute, fubmitted. He endured that very curfe, which we deferved. And if this be not fuffering in our flead, nothing can be called by that name.
