OF HISMAJESTY'S PROVINCE OF

UPPER CANADA.

CHAP. I.

An AEt for the Relief of Clerks to Attornies who may have ferved their Clerkships,

without being bound by Contracts in Writing.

Passed 10th March, 1807.

Preambles
