Reading, Pa., March 6.-Mrs. Kate Edwards, who has been in the shadow the gallows for nearly thirteen years for the killing of her husband, been released from the Berks County Jail under a pardon granted by Governor Tenere and secretly taken from the city to begin life over again. She was convicted of first degre murder in 1901, and sentenced to be hanged, but four gevernors delined to fix a day for her execution. After her conviction, petitions were circulated in many parts of the counry and were signed by thousands of vomen protesting against the execution of one of their sex. Mrs. Edwards' case was several times taken to the Board of Pardons, but commutation of sentence was always re-
