CHICAGO, Oct. 27.—Wheat developed notable strength today in consequence of bullish foreign advices and a huge falling off in the domestic visible supply. The market closed firm at an advance of 1 1/2c to 1 3/4c. Other leading staples, too, showed gains—corn 3/4c to 1 1/2c, oats 1/2c to 3/4c, and provisions 1/2c to 3/4c higher. Liverpool wheat closed 1/2c to 1 1/4c higher; corn, 1/4c to 1/2c higher. Paris closed unchanged to 1/2c up. Antwerp, 1/2c up; Budapest, 1/2c higher. Argentine lower.

WINNIPEG GRAIN MARKET. WHEAT, Oct. 27.—Prices on the local grain market were higher and rapidly advanced from the opening 1 1/2c to 1 3/4c with a strong undercurrent. The spread of wheat was 1 1/2c to 2c for the day. Cash demand for all grades of wheat was keen, the close showing a gain of 2c. Oats were strong and firm heavy. In sight for inspection, 1250 cars.

CATTLE MARKETS. UNION STOCK YARDS. TORONTO, Oct. 27.—Receipts of live stock at the Union Yards yesterday were large—285 cars, comprising 5,000 head of cattle, 2,559 sheep and lambs, 379 calves and 10 horses.

THROUGH CENTRAL B.C. The first white woman to give over the Grand Trunk Pacific route from Edmonton, Alta., to Prince Rupert, B.C., is Miss Ellison, the daughter of the Hon. Diaz Jumps to Rescue Ship

Spectacular Escape. It was late last night when General Felix Diaz became convinced of the advisability of seeking American protection. From the hotel where he had been staying, and which is contiguous to the United States consulate, he made his way to the consular office and informed Consul Canada that he had received information that his life was in peril. He told the consul that a number of his adherents had been put in jail.

The fact that General Felix Diaz and two of his most devoted supporters were refugees on board the Gunboat Wheeling was not discovered by the Mexican authorities until this morning. The flight took place after midnight, the three men then taking the risk of an excursion over the roofs, which were guarded by armed men in the consulate. When they informed the consulate that they were fugitives, the three men were in imminent danger, for at once took steps to have the refugees transferred on board the Gunboat Wheeling, which was lying in the harbor.
