

SYNOPSIS OF Coal Mining Regulations

Coal mining rights of the Dominion, in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the North-West Territory and British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an an-ual rental of \$1 an acre. not more than 2,560 acres will be leasto one applicant.

Application for a lease must be made to the Agent or Sub-Agent of the district in which the rights applied for are situated.

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal sub-divisions of sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out. Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5, which will be refunded if the rights ap-

plied for are not available but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per


