New York, N. Y., Sept. 1.—For the first time in many years it was almost impossible to buy or sell Standard Oil stock today in the New York market. No one had any idea what this stock, which yesterday sold at 634 a share was worth. Even the venturesome traders in the curb market, who usually are ready to make a price for any man who wants to buy or sell anything, were unable to reach a basis for handling the shares of the great oil company.

Standard Oil of New Jersey passed out of existence as a trust stock yesterday in accordance with the supreme court decision that it must divest itself of its holdings of subsidiary companies. Guesses as to how much Standard Oil, stripped of what these subsidiaries were worth a share ran all the way from \$300 to \$500. No price on stock of the subsidiaries can be given.


