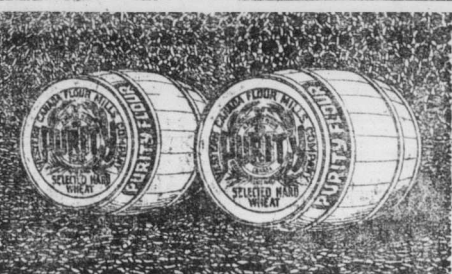

**FROM THE PEOPLE****CARE OF HORSES**

To the Editor of The Gleaner.

Sir,—In your paper recently you have an article headed "Help Horses," by a woman. I am afraid this lady has had very little experience in horses doing heavy work or she would not advocate the breast collar. The breast collar is only useful for buggy work or work that is not steady. When it is used for steady dray work or farm work the horse generally begins to finish the third day of its use, and an examination will show large blisters on the chest where the breast collar has lain. If the skin and flesh of a horse's chest is examined it will be found to be far more tender than on the neck or shoulders, besides the bearing surface should be as large as possible, so as to have less friction. Padding the breast collar does not make much difference. If a horse will a properly fitted collar is sore, it is quite certain that he is getting too much to do, and is getting thin, there being too little flesh padding between the skin and the bones. A fat horse with a well fitted collar and a good teamster never gets called. But it does not matter how fat or how good the teamster is if you try for a few days to use a horse at hard work with a breast collar you will find large blisters, then the whole breast is a raw bleeding mass if you are stupid enough to persist in working the horse and not to back. I think that all stable managers of large concerns, veterinary surgeons and farmers will agree with me.
