Big Cod Shipment.

The S. S. Mercator sailed at 9 last night for Alicante and Naples taking 4,277 packages—casks and drums—containing 14,128 qts. of codfish which is by far the heaviest shipment by steamer yet sent out of this country. The shipment was made by several mercantile firms, and the ship is doing a joint service for the Red Cross-Furness Line. She is the fifth to leave here this season, and the Spica will be soon leaving for Mediterranean ports with another big shipment.
