When we reflect upon the innocent and holy blood which this German sword has shed, we must marvel indeed at the blasphemy of such an invocation, and must wonder whether the downfall of the structure of shame and impiety does not impend.

The Alliance

Against Germany.

London Daily Telegraph: There has never been an Alliance like unto the one which has been cemented to overthrow Prussianism. It has been the result of a process of repulsion from everything German which has gone on for many years. First, Japan, nervous after the Port Arthur incident, when the Kaiser robbed her of the fruit of victory, sought an alliance with this country; afterwards Kaiserism brought to an end the age-long and eventually quite artificial antagonism between France and ourselves; then Russia abandoned her traditional policy; at last Italy deserted the Triple Alliance; and then the United States, which those maledict German diplomats believed to be actuated only by selfish aims, threw in her lot with the enemies of the Central Powers. There has never before been such a conjunction of Great Powers. What would Pitt the younger say to it could he look on the record of the last three years? It was his misfortune to be deserted by first one and then another of his partners, until this country stood alone and isolated. It has been our good fortune to witness the circumference of the Alliance to which we are attached broaden stage by stage. A new spirit of international amity has been engendered. Amour propre has been buried. We have come very near to St. Paul's ideal, for the Allies have everything practically in common—naval and military force, money, and economic strength; all is shared with a fine disregard of national interests and national susceptibilities.
