

He Studied The Catalogues.

Take the matter of a watch. Having made up his mind to buy a wrist watch he reads the ads. of various firms, noting what features they offered—unbreakable crystals, luminous dials, adjustable straps, various jeweled movements, non inflammable crystals, etc.—and at what prices. He sent for several catalogues studied what they had to say and then made up his mind just about what features he wanted and how much he wanted to invest. Then he went to a shop and looked at the various watches and told the clerk just what he wanted.

Sultan Has Screen of Human Skin.

There are many priceless relics in the menage of the Sultan of Turkey, most of which symbolize brutality and vice. But the romance of the famous screen in the throne room of the Sultan's palace is worth repeating. It is made of human skin, perfectly tanned and elaborately tooled and embossed, and it has been in the Royal quarters for more than two centuries. This remarkable screen is not an evidence of cruelty or barbarity on the part of Turkey's ruler two hundred years ago, but is a memorial to twelve faithful servants of a former Sultan. At one time during the Sultan's reign, two hundred years ago, a wing of the palace caught fire, and during the conflagration a much-beloved member of the Sultan's family was rescued by twelve servants. The twelve servants perished, some of them dying later of their wounds and burns, so His Majesty had their skins removed by an expert and had them preserved in this touching, though remarkable, manner. The screen is now looked upon as a part of the ruler's inheritance, and it is said that every Sultan cherishes it as a mascot.

Young Girls Slain by Bolshevists.

Many persons accused of being counter-revolutionists are being executed in Budapest by the Hungarian Communists. The victims usually are shot in front of the Hungarian Parliament House in the daytime or in the public schoolyard in the Markotstrasse at night. Among those who are said to have been executed are Herr Holan, Manager of the Kaschau-Oderberg Railway; Bishop Balhasar, a hostage from Debreczen, and Colonel Dornmany, of the General Staff, who was taken from hospital. Several girls, who were accused of making tri-

color rosettes for the counter-revolutionists, also were executed. The presiding Judge of the revolutionary tribunal which orders the executions, it is said, is a former locksmith, twenty-two years of age. Many bodies of men and women and girls of the better class have been found on the shores of islands in the Danube below the city. It is reported that they were arrested in the residential quarter of Duda and were thrown into the Danube by guards who were taking them to prison in Pest. French colonial troops, the reports add, are expected to move on the city from the south. White guards and counter-revolutionists are preparing to cross the River Theiss, where they have taken positions evacuated by the Roumanians, who were withdrawn to the Bessarabian front.

Household Notes.

Put salt or soda on insect stings. Vinegar will remove stains from zinc.

Mousses are made of heavy cream. Fine sandpaper is a neat eraser for ink.

Oxide of zinc will clean white leather.

Piano keys can be cleaned with alcohol.

Crochet cotton is best for darning stockings.

Glass baking dishes are a constant joy.

Gelatine desserts are ideal for hot weather.

Old felt hats can be cut up for insoles of shoes.

Canvas gloves are excellent to use when dusting.

Try serving orange fritters to accompany fried ham.

Envelope drawers can be made out of old nightgowns.

Sprinkle cinnamon on the stove after cooking cabbage.

Add lemon or orange rind to rhubarb when cooking.

Whipping a jelly increases its bulk two or three times.

Very young chickens and turkeys thrive well on sour milk.

Dry flour, applied with a newspaper, will clean tinware.

Egg stains may be removed from silver by rubbing with salt.

Use a fine grater to remove the surface of anything burned.

A few bread crumbs added to scrambled eggs improve them.

Wet the cut end of ham with vinegar to keep from moulding.

One iron kettle for deep fat climbing is a necessity in every kitchen.

Oil or pure glycerine rubbed on very fresh eggs will keep them so.
