



It is notified for the information of all concerned that all claims for SEPARATION ALLOWANCE on account of men of the Royal Naval Reserve (Nfid.), the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, or the Newfoundland Forestry Corps, should be filed at the Department of Militia on or before 31st March, 1920, and no claims received after that date will be considered. All dependents of Naval Reservists and soldiers who have not already claimed this allowance should apply to The Paymaster, Department of Militia, St. John's, for an application form in order to make claim at once. It should be borne in mind that the claim is admissible only if the Naval Reservist is the sole or main support of the claimant.
