Bishop's Visit to Curling.

The Lord Bishop of Newfoundland, who is making a visitation of the West Coast and Labrador, arrived in St. John's from Bay St. George by Friday No. 2 express train, accompanied by his chaplain Rev. Canon Baxby. A. Bunting, floated to the breeze on the various staffs, and a large number of citizens assembled at the station to extend to His Lordship a very welcome on this his first visit to the Parish of Bay of Islands since consecration. The Episcopal party were met at the train by the Rev. and Churchwardens, who accompanied them to the Rectory. A number of appropriate selections were made by the Bishop, and the church which were very much appreciated. A magnificent arch had been erected over the main gate leading to the Rectory, and the church of St. Mary's, which is a beautiful gothic structure, was thronged with people, when the address of welcome—on vellum, signed by representatives of the Anglican congregations of Bay of Islands, to which Bishop White made a table and appropriate reply. The Bishop followed, at which the principal preached, dealing principally with the subject of Confirmation. Confirmation at John's Beach.

On Saturday morning the Episcopal party, accompanied by the Rector and warden, joined the steamer George and proceeded to John's Beach, where at 11 a.m. Confirmation was administered to 25 persons. As the steamer came to anchor the inhabitants of that part of the parish flocked to the beach and extended a most cordial welcome to their Bishop. A very pretty arch had been erected over the entrance to the church grounds, and the service of Confirmation, which was served in the school, was the young ladies of the place gave every attention to the needs of the liner man.

At Melville's. Amidst cheers and musketry the Bishop and party again boarded the steamer and proceeded to Melville's. Similar manifestations of welcome were exhibited. At 2.30 p.m. a group of about 200 persons, headed by the Bishop, proceeded to the Rectory. This was followed at three o'clock by His Lordship administering the Sacrament of Confirmation to candidates. Quite a number of people—including some of the candidates—motored from Middle Arm, and the school chapel which had been very tastefully decorated for the occasion, was filled to its utmost capacity.

At 10.45 Sunday morning the Bishop, accompanied by his chaplain and the Rector, proceeded to the cemetery at Curling, the people of the parish being read by Mr. N. Reg. C.W., after which His Lordship celebrated Holy Communion. St. Mary's Church, and preached the Gospel for the day. At 3 p.m. confirmation was administered to 108 candidates. The Bishop's address on the different services were very interesting and instructive and were listened to with rapt attention by the large concourse of people, which fills the sacred edifice on each occasion.

Yesterday morning Bishop White, accompanied by his chaplain and the Rector, proceeded to the Rectory for the s.s. George. The other during the episcopal visitation has been very deeply impressed by what he has seen and appreciated the cordial welcome extended everywhere.
