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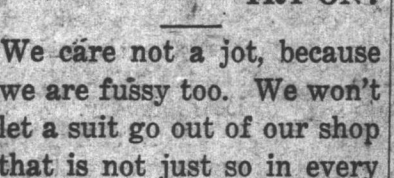
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The Herring Fishery

With the arrival of the herring packing season comes a little extra stir upon the waters. The movement of barrels, etc., entail considerable labour. Several packing firms are opening their stations this week. The North American Packing Company will operate three stations, as follows: Penquin Arm, Middle Arm, and Curling. This is a new company to operate here. It is reported that the Bask Company did not pack last year. One or two firms which packed last year will not engage in the industry this season, and some others of the old packers will operate on reduced scale. Prospects, however, for the industry are somewhat brighter than they were last season. The Scotch catch of fish the past summer were very small and not satisfactory for the American market. The Pacific fishery, according to latest advices, has been practically a failure, and the fish, according to authorities, altogether unsuitable for the requirement of the Scotch pack herring. Consequently it appears that the American trade has to fall back upon Newfoundland for good, fat, large herrings, as pointed out by E. S. Williamson, Chairman of the Smoked Fish Trade Committee of the United States Fisheries Association's annual convention last August, and published in our issue of 8th ult. Mr. Williamson states that there are no large, fat herring caught in the United States and the fish caught are unsuitable also for the smoked fish trade, and as a result there has been a big falling off in that business. There was a time when Gloucester and other New England ports had and maintained a large fleet of salt-bulk fishing schooners, and many of them came to Bay of Islands and Bonne Bay at this season of the year for cargoes of salt-bulk herring. The United States salt fleet has had to give place to that of the fresh fish trade and the new fishing vessels are unsuitable for the salt-bulk herring fishery. A few of the old-timers are still in existence, however, and we understand some of these will likely come here this fall.

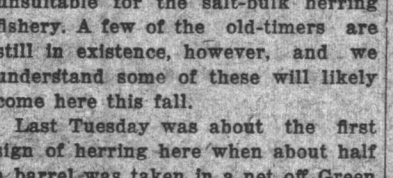
Last Tuesday was about the first sign of herring here when about half a barrel was taken in a net off Green Island. A few have since been caught at Middle Arm, and one report stated that some fish were taken at North Arm. Schools of herring have been seen at the outer part of the bay, according to reports reaching us, and no doubt these fish will strike in with the approach of colder weather.

At Bonne Bay herring have made their appearance and some packers have commenced operations.—Western Star.

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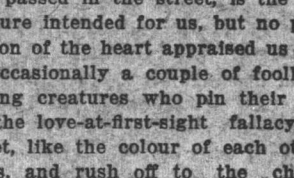
