The November meeting was held last night. Arrangements for the annual show to be held Nov. 28th, 29th and 30th, in the C.L.B. Armory were finalized. His Excellency the Governor, the patron of the Association will open the Exhibition, and Lady Allardice has promised to distribute the prizes on Friday night, Nov. 30th at 9 o'clock. Judge E. E. Trehill, of Antigonish, will place the awards. Eighteen silver cups are offered as well as many special prizes. A special cup will be offered to the exhibitor showing his birds for the first time. The annual dinner will be held in the Armory on Thursday Nov. 28 at 8.30. The Judge and Minister of Agriculture will be the special guests of the Committee. Judge Clayton arrives from Corner Brook and reports many of the citizens of the new town there most enthusiastic poultrymen, and are arranging to raise lots of English White Leghorns for the 1924 show. Sir William Horwood has offered a special prize of ten dollars for wild geese—birds to be bred in captivity. His Excellency the Governor offers a silver cup to the competitor winning the largest number of Blue Ribbons in the show. Capt. Goodfellow, Private Secretary has imported from H. V. Tormolen of Portland, Indiana, a Brown Leghorn rooster. The placing of the coop containing the bird with Mr. Tormolen is seen in Nov. issue of the "Lighthouse World." Capt. Goodfellow is an enthusiastic poultry breeder and sends a string of feathered beauties to the exhibition.

The Lottery Committee reports tickets are going well. There will be a model house after the latest type known as "Borden" house with a hood roof. A pen of general purpose fowls will also be a prize. Spencer Club are catering afternoon teas and six o'clock teas. They will also cater to the dinner of the Association. The Bell Island Poultry Club are holding their exhibition the 22nd, 23rd November and His Excellency the Governor will make a special trip to open the exhibition. President Hughes and Secretary Fred J. Jardine, J.P., are making all arrangements to have the best show for years.
