TO-DAY'S MESSAGES

GOVERNOR FOUND GUILTY.
INDIANAPOLIS, April 28.
Governor T. Gray was found guilty of using the mails to furtherance of a scheme to defraud by the jury in the Federal Court here at 3.30 p.m. after ten minutes deliberation.

MASSEY ON DOMINION RESPONSIBILITY.

WELLINGTON, N.Z., April 28.
Premier W. F. Massey, speaking at a state lunch here to-day to the officers of the visiting British special service squadron on the Empire cruise said, "Great Britain alone cannot bear the whole burden of naval defence. The Dominions have done their share but more is required if the sea force is to be kept in an efficient state. The last has not been heard of the Singapore naval base scheme and the Dominions must stand to their responsibilities."

OTHER ARRESTS IN ONTARIO GOVERNMENT SCANDAL.

TORONTO, April 28.
E. V. Donnelly, chief clerk of the Provincial Secretary's Department, was arrested this afternoon on a charge of theft of about \$7,000 in monies belonging to the Province. Harold Thomas, a clerk in the Department was also arrested. The arrest followed an audit begun several weeks ago disclosing about \$9,000 shortage. Donnelly is out on \$10,000 bail. Thomas being unable to raise \$5,000 bail was confined to the cells.

REFERS BOUNDARY QUESTION TO COLONIAL OFFICE.

LONDON, April 28.
The Irish Free State's Government has sent a note to the British Colonial Office asking that it give effect to the boundary article of the Anglo-Irish Treaty without further delay, says a despatch to the Daily Mail from Dublin. All efforts to adjust the boundary line between Ulster and the Irish Free State have proved unavailing. Last week another conference on the subject was held in London between representatives of Northern and Southern Ireland but it came to naught. Under the terms of the Anglo-Irish Treaty the British Government in case of failure by the Northern and Southern Governments in Ireland to reach an agreement is to appoint a Boundary Commission, which will draw a definite line between the respective territories.

GERMANY'S DEFAULTING IS THE QUESTION.

PARIS, April 29.
At to-day's conference whole question of pressure on Germany, the results to obtain from the occupation of the Ruhr, and the proper form of eventual penalties to be applied to Germany in case of default in execution of the experts' plan was canvassed in its military, political and financial aspects with Marshal Foch, Paul Tirard, President of the International Rhineland Commission and M. Francois Marshall, the French Finance Minister participating as Counsellors. The rapidly with which accord was reached was taken in political circles as indicating that the Belgians had agreed with Premier Poincaré that some plan for the eventual application of penalties must be adopted before the Allies could abandon pledges held in Ruhr.

MACDONALD ARDENTLY SUPPORTS EXPERTS' REPORT.

PORT TALBOT, Wales, April 29.
Prime Minister MacDonald speaking here to-night to the electors who sent him to Parliament declared he was not going to lose a single chance of putting the Experts' report into operation, "and I want France to be with me, let there be no doubt about it," he said. "I regard the Experts' report," continued Mr. MacDonald, "as an opportunity for a peace settlement and an agreement which if not taken advantage of by European statesmen will be one of the most godsend opportunities ever neglected and lost."

A TERRIBLE MINING DISASTER.

WHEELING, W.V.A., April 29.
Fourteen bodies have been recovered to-night from Benwood mine of the Wheeling Steel Co-oreparation where 114 miners were entombed to-day by an explosion. Hope has been practically abandoned for the other hundred miners.
