

Of this number the greater majority has left school, having completed the school course, 600 of them

at 12 years of age, provided they sat

being at work. The above figures are as nearly accurate as we cn expect to get them as we have index cards giving particulars, name, age, and address of every boy in the city with the exception of three and we have their names and approximate ages but not full particulars.

It is to be regretted so many boys have to leave school at 13 years of age, owing to the financial condition of the home, and I trust the day will improvement in this direction. But aking all in all the above figures are very creditable to our city, much more so in fact than many have heretofore
