

ARREST OF A MURDERER.—The Buffalo Express has the following concerning the arrest of the murderer Hoag: "On the 15th of February last, a man named Neubecker, of Carrick, Bruce county, Canada, was murdered and robbed between the villages of Wroxeter and Belmore, by one John Hoag, a young man who was known in that part of the country as a deserter from the United States service. Hoag succeeded in making his escape with the murdered man's money, consisting of the proceeds of a quantity of grain which he had sold on that day. Nothing was heard of him until a few days since, when Superintendent Reynolds learned that he had returned and delivered himself up to the officer of his regiment at Fort Columbus, Arkansas. Patrolman George Grim was sent for the man, and returned yesterday afternoon with the prisoner, who was at once sent to await a call from the Canadian Government. Hoag is a short, thick-set man, only 20 years of age. The Buffalo office will secure a reward which had been offered by the authorities of the Perth County.

CREDITABLE.—The amount received by Mr R. C. Jones, treasurer of the relief fund at Halifax, from all sources in the provinces of Quebec and Ontario, was, up to the 7th inst., \$19,604.88, besides \$700 received by his Excellency, Gen. Doyle. Of that amount Montreal contributed \$2,000, Toronto \$2,050.
