Amoy Situation Is Alarming

Japs Break the Agreement of the Powers!

And Fresh Troubles Are Feared—Allies Take the District

West of Pekin—Li Wants to Have Prince Tuan Arrested—

The Wounded With the Women and Children

Sent From Pekin to Tien Tsin.

New York, Aug. 28.—A dispatch from Amoy, China, says: The Japanese have been landing marines for three days, not only without provocation, but against the protest of the consuls. Accidental destruction of the Japanese temple by fire was the alleged excuse for their act, but the Amoy officials have proved their ability to preserve perfect order. There are 300 marines landing today. The excitement is intense, and thousands of civilians are leaving the city. The officials, with scores of merchants, have visited the American consulate, pleading with the consul to intercede for the withdrawal of the marines; otherwise they declare it will be impossible to preserve order.
