Milwaukee Has Several Markets for Infants.

THERE IS A SCALE OF PRICES

But to Get Rid of Stock They Frequently Go at Any Old Figure.

Milwaukee, Wis., Feb. 13.-City authorities of Milwaukee have discovered that babies are bought and sold like so much live stock.

Supt. Spindler, of the Poor Department, has a list of ten places where infants are marketed. There is no attempt to make adoption legal.

At these places babies are left without questioning, provided the persons leaving the children make payment of from \$10 to \$20. Afterwards they are turned over to any person who is willing to pay a few dollars for them. If they cannot be sold they are given

This state of things was unearthed by the application of Mrs. Helen Purdy, 392 Fourteenth street, for support of an infant. It was found that the infant in question had been left with the woman, who had been paid \$10 by the mother, a young woman of Mineral Point, Wis., to take it away, but she being unable to do so had applied for support for it. Supt. Spindler when he learned the story communicated with the Iowa County authorities, and the child was sent there to be cared for.

The investigations which followed disclosed the fact that besides Mrs. Purdy there were half a dozen other places where babies were taken for a small sum and then disposed of without any formalities to other persons if they desired a baby. If the keepers could get something for the child, well and good; if not, then they were got rid of in any way to save the friends in London. cost of their keeping. 
