BIRMINGHAM SOLID FOR JOSEPH

[Continued from Page One.]
London, Jan. 17.—Chamberlain is
still king in Birmingham.

Not only did he carry his own seat
by an increased majority in the elec-
tions today, but his candidates also
swept the other seven divisions by
aggregating majorities of 30,000, after one
of the stiffest fights in history.

A solid Conservative Birmingham
bends forth a ray of light into the
darkness which otherwise continues to
enshroud the party.

A strenuous campaign was prose-
cuted in West Birmingham by Out-
waite, an Australian, prominent in
labor circles. He succeeded in polling
only 2,084, against 7,173 for Chamber-
lain, thus giving the Liberal reform
leader a majority of 5,075, as com-
pared with 4,2
