

Minister of Finance Points Out Necessity of Curtailment and Cuts Off All Public Works For Present Time.

Ottawa, April 20 .- A surplus of one and a half million dollars for a year in which, in common with practically every other country, Canada has been confronted with falling revenues and prospects of a deficit, was the gratifying announcement made by Hon. Mr. Fielding is his thirteenth budget speech in the House of Commons. The story which the Minister of Finance had to tell no doubt suffered in Toronto comparison with previous chapters of Montreal trade, of growing revenues and of business developments, which has been the history of the Dominion for the past twelve years, but in circum stances created by the recent worldwide financial stringency, and in view of the experience of other countries, where a remedy has been sought in an increase of taxation, the result of the past year's operations in Canada Wearther No.
