Keep Them Going.

At this stage, some people consider their chicks long past the critical stage and therefore in many cases especially the farm flocks are allowed to run over the harvest fields to forage for themselves to a large extent, and at the same time, cutting their feed down proportionately, expecting them to make up the rest of their rations from the fields. This is a splendid practice where the harvest has been heavy and there is a considerable amount of grain lying about on the ground, but where the harvest has been light, it is a great mistake not to go on giving full rations, as they are apt to be under nourished and become debilitated. Chiccks at this stage should be kept growing at full capacity, for if they lose weight now, they will never make it up later no matter how well you feed them and when full-grown they are apt to lack in size. At the time of hatching, the chicks usually weigh about one and a half ounces
