

Mr. McGregor, called to the stand to testify in his own behalf, declared that, while in the employ of the Signry, he received a better offer from another firm. He accepted this, and told the Signry people that he was quitting.

NATIONAL PARKS OFFICIAL SPEAKS

Addresses the MacIlwraith Take Salts to Flush Kidneys and Ornithological Club on "Bird Life and Sanctuaries."

Bird-lovers who failed to attend the lecture at the Normal School Tuesday evening missed a rare treat. It was held under the auspices of the MacIlwraith Ornithological Club. The first part of the program was an illustrated address on "Bird Life and the Dominion Bird Sanctuaries," by Frank B. Forster, B.A., of the parks department of the dominion

government.

Mr. Forster painted a glowing picture of the wealth and beauty of our Canadian West, and gave a most interesting account of the huge parks set aside by the federal government for the preservation of large game animals and birds.

There are some 10.000 square miles

of these parks and reserves through-out the west, in which are about 7,000 buffalo, several hundred antelope, Rocky Mountain sheep and goats, several species of deer, and countless caribou. All these animals, which a few years are reamed the west in few years ago roamed the west in countless numbers, were rapidly nearing extinction. Now, thanks to

Smaller tracts of land, especially around small lakes, where the land and lemon unice combined with is unfit for agricultural purposes have been made into bird sanctu-aries. One of these, the Jackson Lake preserve, near Brandon, Man. was shown on the screen. Here hundreds of white pelicans, cormorants, gulls, terns, herons and ducks were breeding in perfect security. fines of their sanctuary. TEA CONTINUES TO **ADVANCE IN PRICE**

Expect a Ten-Cent Rise For Medium Grades Before Christmas.

The steady ascent of tea prices within the past two months shows no signs of coming to a halt. According to local retailers another advance of 10 cents a pound for medium grades n be expected before Christmas.

Reasons for the unprecedented reail costs of tea are said to be the crop shortage and increased demand. Only in the year 1919 have tea prices been as high as they are at present. In 1920-21 a tremendous yield was April 7 Laconia enjoyed, and over-production was the rule. Consequently the market was glutted and many plantations were allowed to waste. planters arranged to grow 50 per cent less than in 1921. But they did not take into account the long successive periods of rain and drought, which ractically ruined their crops.

Last year medium-quality tea brought from 35 to 50 cents a pound. The present price is about 65 cents, and 75 cents for the same quality is predicted within the month. The increase in cost over last year is said to be from 25 to 40 per cent.

Until the 1923 yield is computed, no mitigation of the tea situation is likely.
