

ANNUAL LOBO UNION PICNIC ATTENDED BY NEARLY 5,000

Chilly Weather Is Little Draw-back To Gathering at Poplar Hill.
12 SCHOOLS PARADE

Despite chilly weather the annual Lobo union school picnic held yesterday at the Lobo Memorial park, Poplar Hill, was marked by an attendance of between 4,000 and 5,000 people.

President P. Campbell and his brother, J. D. Campbell, chairman of the parade committee, led the parade to the flagpole, where the annual flag-raising ceremony, which each year marks the official opening of the day's program, was held. Twelve schools of the Lobo district participated in the parade, which was marshalled by C. E. Piper, drill sergeant, and paraded to music supplied by the Strathroy military band.

After the raising of the flag to half-mast and the observing of one minute's silence in memory of the late Col. Bart. Robson, prominent in the history of the Lobo picnic since it was first organized many years ago, and who passed away since last year's picnic, the flag was raised to full-mast by two school children, Leslie Carmichael, S.S. No. 3, Coldstream, and Margaret Wilson, S.S. No. 8, Lobo, and the National Anthem was sung. The flag was again placed at half-mast, where it hung for the remainder of the day.

30 Babies Entered.
Perhaps the feature of the whole day was the baby show and clinic, in which 30 babies were entered, making the largest entry-list since the baby show was organized by A. C. Ferguson for the first time three years ago. Dr. W. L. Denny, baby specialist, London, assisted by Mrs. A. Stapleton, Miss C. Fraser and Mrs. Gordon Weir, all of the child welfare association, London, acted as the judge and conducted the clinic. Speaking to the Advertiser, the judge commented very favorably upon the splendid physical and mental strength of the babies entered in the competition.

First prize for the school making the best appearance and marching in the parade was won by McDougall's school, S.S. No. 8, the pupils of which, under their teacher, Miss Ruth Campbell, were attired in white as doctors and nurses, with a white apron, purple and orange, draped over their shoulders.

Bear Creek school, S.S. No. 7, under Miss Bloomfield as teacher, second place with effective costumes in white, orange and black. The third place went to Poplar Hill school, S.S. No. 10, which, under their teacher, Basil Wilson, was gotten up as sailors in blue and white, while fourth honors were won by Lobo school, S.S. No. 8, which, under their teacher, Lulu Clark as teacher, at the head, represented the British Empire.

Softball Match.
For the special class for schools with less than 15 pupils enrolled, the prizes were won by McDougall's school, S.S. No. 2, Miss Branton, teacher, and Dewar's school, S.S. No. 5, Miss McIlwain, teacher. Captain A. W. Lyons, Greenway, acted as judge of the parade, for which cash prizes, totalling \$16, were distributed. Ilderton and Coldstream softball school girls contested a softball match that proved very interesting, though the final result was not quite certain.

29 FIRST CARS STOP AT CAMP

First Week in June Gives Promise of Big Year At Wonderland.

Twenty-nine tourist automobiles were entertained by the public utilities commission at the Wonderland tourist camp from June 1 to June 8 inclusive.

Ninety-nine people travelled in the 29 cars, which hailed from nearly every state in the United States, while there was only one from Ontario and that from Toronto.

The receipts of the camp, at the rate of \$1 per automobile per night, have been satisfactory to date and such as to meet the expenses of improvements made to the camp, as well as to its maintenance throughout the season.

Little or no protest has been made of the charge, while one party insisted that the charge should more properly be \$1 per night per person travelling in the car.

It is interesting to note that more than half of the tourist cars carried more than two people. Two cars had six people, six had five people, five had four people, and five had three people.

The Wonderland register being kept by the commission, again this year, as last, supplies data for each party as to the date and time of arrival, name, license number of the car, number in the party, and place of home residence.

Thomas Clift, 22-year-old London athlete who was seriously injured in a baseball game in St. Louis on Saturday May 30, is now expected to recover, according to a telegram received this morning by his brother-in-law, Fred W. Bilyea, 650 Princess avenue. Mr. Clift is a son of Alderman Thomas Clift.

Skull injuries were aggravated yesterday, necessitating set and for more than a week the five doctors in attendance at the lad's bedside in St. Luke's Hospital held little hope for his life. Warm weather retarded the patient's progress and city relatives were notified yesterday that his condition was worse. Today's telegram, however, brought the tidings that the crisis had been passed.

Clift, who was playing for a Detroit nine, stepped to the plate to check a squeeze play and in so doing was struck by the bat as the batter tried to hit the ball. Though seriously injured, he regained consciousness in fifteen minutes.

Mr. and Mrs. Clift and their daughter have been at the youth's bedside for nearly a week.
